

2023-24 Test Results at-a-Glance

- GCPS schools averaged a 4-star rating (2023-24).
- English Language Arts proficiency for Grades 3-8 demonstrated a rate of 49.0%, above the state average of 47.1%, and ELA 10 at 56.3%, compared to the state average of 55.3%.
- Mathematics Grades 3-8 show a proficiency rate of 28.7%, above the state average of 25.2%, and Algebra I at 28.7%, above the state average of 20.0%.
- Science Grade 5 demonstrated proficiency of 26.5%, above the state average of 23.9%, and Grade 8 proved 28.4% proficiency, above the 24.9% state average.

Of note, every category for GCPS was higher than the state average.
