 - o Believe that each student can learn at his/her pace and strive to meet individual needs
 - Provide summer and after school programs as recommended by families on the community school needs assessment.
 - Incorporate opportunities for educational experiences or enrichment regarding our local culture, history, trades, and careers
- Hold parent-teacher conferences annually, during which this compact will be discussed as it relates to the individual child's achievement
 - o Conferences are held at the beginning of the third grading term and by appointments during the school year.
 - o IEP meetings are conducted as mandated or requested.
 - o Parents may schedule a meeting with teachers as needed during their planning times. Meetings should be arranged a few days in advance.
- Provide parents with frequent reports on their child's progress
 - o Progress reports are sent home via Schoolmessenger at mid-term intervals. (Paper copies are available for those without email)
 - o Teachers may send home weekly results of chapter tests, etc.
 - o Provide & encourage parent access to PowerSchool Parent Portal and Schoology.
 - o Teachers commit to sending home a monthly positive communication note on children based on PBIS expectations.
 - Teachers will utilize at least two forms of parent communication.

Provide parents with reasonable access to staff

- o Beyond the scheduled parent conference nights set forth by GCPS, teachers and parents may schedule appointments to discuss matters related to their child's education at any time throughout the school year.
- o Each staff member will communicate to families through the student planner or an electronic means as established by individual teachers.
- o Parents receive a regular newsletter of school information, activities and events.

- Teachers will participate in extracurricular activities when possible.
- A Back-to-School Night is held a few days before school begins to give families an opportunity to meet their child's teachers and receive important information about the upcoming school year.
- Provide parent opportunities to volunteer and participate in their child's class, and to observe classroom activities.
 - o Parents will be welcomed into the classrooms for observation given an appointment has been arranged in advance.
 - o Parents may volunteer for the classroom by scheduling a time with their child's teacher.
 - o Parents may sign up for volunteer opportunities by completing a survey designed to capture individual strengths.
 - Parents who desire to volunteer will get a personal email or phone call via principal or designated staff member.
 - Offer a virtual Google Meet option for SIT, PTO, PBIS, etc.. meetings to accommodate parents' busy schedules and allow them to participate more frequently.

Parent Responsibilities

We, as parents, will support our children's learning by:

- Making sure my child attends school every day and is on time.
- Making sure that homework is completed.
- Checking and signing the student planner or Schoology Account, if required, for assignments and communications.
- Attend school conferences and review school expectations and procedures.
- Request parent-teacher conferences beyond the regularly scheduled conferences, throughout the school year as needed regarding educational concerns/questions.
- Attending Back-to-School Night and having the opportunity to participate in the **Parent Teacher Organization (PTO)** related events.
