Public Comment

 Mr. Nathaniel Watkins, a community member, spoke to the Board about the proposed Swan Meadow Heritage Charter School.

Recognitions

 Mr. Don Morin recognized American Education Week, November 18-22, 2024, by presenting a proclamation on behalf of the Board. Mrs. Heather Gosnell, Teacher and President of the Garrett County Education Association, received the declaration on behalf of all teachers and staff members.

New Business

- Ms. Gloria Smith, Director of Finance, presented a preliminary report on the FY2025-26 budget development, including an enrollment update and revenue estimates. She answered various questions from the Board.
- Dr. Brenda McCartney made a recommendation regarding Swan Meadow Heritage Charter School to extend the application period by one year and amend the benchmark dates, for a targeted charter status for the 2026-27 school year. The Board discussed the recommendation. The Board voted unanimously to approve the measure.

 Mr. Richard Wesolowski, Director of System Operations, presented the FY2024-25 Comprehensive Maintenance Plan to the Board for approval. Dr. McCartney recommended approval of the plan. The Board voted unanimously to approve the plan.

Student Reports

- Athletics NGHS Girls Soccer finished the season first in the region. SGHS Boys Soccer finished with a record of 12-3, marking the most successful team in the school's history.
- SGHS Marching Band finished in 5th place for their division.
- The SGHS Football team performed a community service project at Crellin Elementary School.
- Emelee Parks and Ben Brobst were recognized as all-staters in cross country.
- Karma Spak, Ava Stewart, and Kathryn Sweitzer each have artwork selected for the MAEA BWI Fall 2024 exhibition.
- Hank Lewis and Carter Goff participated in the state golf tournament. Lewis finished in 8th place. The NGHS golf team finished in the top ten.
- Fox45—Baltimore featured Crellin
 Elementary for achieving five stars in the
 state ratings. They were the only Title I
 school to achieve this feat in the state.

Student Council (GCASC)

- GCASC held its first General Assembly at the PAC, led by President Kambria Kyle.
- The Fall Leadership Conference will occur on 11/23 at Havre de Grace High School.
- They are participating in the Festival of Trees, with an "Honoring Veterans" themed tree.
- Broad Ford Elementary is collecting materials and money for Flood Buckets, which will be used for disaster relief from Hurricane Helene.
- SGHS 7th-8th grades: Students met to plan the 7th/8th Homecoming Dance. They are also discussing service projects for the year.
- SGHS 9th-12th grades: Held their Homecoming. Planned for the Ram Rumble taking place the day before the Thanksgiving break. Building the holiday light show at Broadford Park. Celebrated

- National Bus Driver Appreciation Week with a breakfast for drivers.
- NGMS: Received the "Silent Heroes" grant to honor soldiers from the Korean War. Building a LEGO centerpiece for the Festival of Trees. Delivered an impressive donation of aluminum can tabs to the Ronald McDonald House Charities of Morgantown.

Superintendent Updates

Dr. McCartney provided the following updates:

- She applauded the community support for our schools in recognition of Veteran's Day. "It was magnificent." She thanked everyone who participated in these very meaningful activities.
- She shared that two Coffee with the Superintendent meetings have occurred.
 She appreciated the input from members of the community who were able to attend and share their views. These meetings will be hosted periodically.

- She highlighted a community meeting, which will be held on November 25th at Northern Middle School from 6:00 PM to 7:30 PM, regarding the proposed relocation of Accident Elementary to the Northern Middle building, creating a PK-7 school, and moving the 8th-grade students to Northern High School.
- The Maryland Youth Risk Behavior Survey will be administered at NX, NH, and SH in early December. The survey is posted on the county website for parents/guardians to review. She emphasized that the information from the survey helps plan student services support programs. She also noted that parents/guardians may opt out on behalf of their child.
- Finally, she shared a calendar reminder:
 There will be a 3-hour early dismissal on Nov. 27th, and then schools will be closed on November 28th, 29th, and December 2nd for Thanksgiving break.
